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

# 2018 Keynote Address



**Dr. Noemi Marin** *Florida Atlantic University* 

The FCA is proud to announce Dr. Noemi Marin as the keynote speaker at our 88<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention. Adhering to the theme, Transnationality, Tolerance & Communication, Dr. Marin will speak to the role of communication in traversing international disparities in the current globalized milieu.

Dr. Marin is a prolific international scholar whose research focuses on communist and post-communist discourse and societies in transition. As a Romanian who emigrated to the United States before the fall of communism, Dr. Marin is uniquely situated to critique public voices in communist and transitional governments. In addition to teaching graduate and undergraduate courses in communication and rhetoric at Florida Atlantic University, Dr. Marin has been a guest lecturer at several national and international institutions, including Harvard University, Columbia University, and University of Lisbon. Dr. Marin is widely published, and has authored and co-authored several books: Rhetorics of 1989 (2015), After the Fall: Rhetoric in the Aftermath of Dissent in Post-Communist Times (2007), Negotiating Democracy: Media Transformation in Emerging Democracies (contributor, 2007); Advances in the History of Rhetoric (contributor, 2007; 2006); Realms of Exile: Nomadism, Diaspora and Eastern European Voices (contributor, 2005); Intercultural Communication and Creative Practices (contributor, 2005); Culture and Technology in the New Europe: Civic Discourse in Transformation in Post-Communist Nations (contributor, 2000). Most recently, Dr. Marin published her second book of poetry in her native Romanian; the title roughly translates to Air of Escape (2017).




