Orlando: More to Enjoy By Cynthia Irizarry

Orlando is one of the most popular cities for conferences. Those attending this year's FCA conference will find many events and attractions in this lovely city. While Orlando is certainly known for its theme parks, there is a host of activities that offer cultural, educational and culinary enjoyment.

Interested in art? Orlando offers many museums, both general and specialized. The largest of these venues is the *Orlando Museum of Art*. Running through October, OMA will be featuring the works of Eliot Porter in the exhibit, "The Color of Wildness." The *Mennello Museum of American Folk Art* is also located in the downtown Orlando area and features both local and national exhibits. In Winter Park, the *Morse Museum of Art* features a comprehensive collection of the work of Louis Comfort Tiffany. Also in Winter Park, on the campus of Rollins College, is the *Cornell Fine Arts Museum*. The admission for museums ranges from \$3.00 to \$6.00. The Cornell Museum is free.

Interested in theater? The *UCF Shakespeare Theatre* will be in full swing during your stay. The feature performance the weekend of October 16th is "The Tempest." Other local productions are also offered. For example, The *Osceola Players* will be performing Ivan Menchall's "The Cemetery Club" and the *Mad Cow Theater* in downtown Orlando will be performing "The Fantastiks."

Interested in music? Check out the Orlando Philharmonic at the *Bob Carr Center for the Performing Arts*. The Philharmonic will be performing American greats such as Gershwin and Copeland on October 18th. If Blues is more your preference, guitarist Robert Cray will be performing at the *Hard Rock Live* in the Universal City Walk complex on October 17th.

More adventurous in your musical tastes? Try local acts performing at the *House of Blues* at the Downtown Disney complex or rub elbows with hip locals at the *Orlando Social Club* in Downtown Orlando. For the brave at heart, sing karaoke in front of hundreds of diners at the *Motown Café* in the Universal City Walk complex.

Interested in learning? *The Orlando Science Center* is a low-cost way to learn about our universe through many fine interactive activities and exhibits. The *Orange County Regional History Center*, also located in downtown Orlando, explores the cultural roots of Central Florida. If you'll be bringing children, these venues are excellent, low-cost alternatives to the theme parks.



Interested in dining? Both *Downtown Disney* and *Universal City Walk* offer many moderately priced theme restaurants. Be prepared for very long-lines. In some cases, reservations will be needed such as at *Emeril's*, Universal. You can find additional dining in the I-drive area. Two places are noteworthy and moderately priced. *Bahama Breeze* offers Caribbean and Cuban cuisine and *The Bonefish Grill* specializes in seafood. Both are winners

of the *Orlando Sentinel's* Foodie Award. Before you think that Orlando offers only chain food fare, there are also many good local restaurants far from the theme park crowds. On the cheap, *NYPD Pizza* has the best New York style slice in the city and *Le Coq au Vin* offers excellent French cuisine at moderate prices. If you really want to splurge, try *Del Frisco's Steak House* for gourmet steaks and seafood.

For more information, the Friday edition of the *Orlando Sentinel* offers a comprehensive weekend section that rates all restaurants, lists all theatrical and musical performances and provides admission information for parks and attractions. The weekend section also provides current discount admissions for Florida residents.
